As I write this it isn't even Christmas yet! I am reading about the Angel of the Lord speaking to Joseph through dreams. So many times in scripture God spoke to people through dreams.

I have dreams for First Lutheran too! I dream that we all continue to hear the Word of God speak to us, call us, and gather us into the one true faith. I pray that we all grow closer together and closer to Christ. I pray that each of our relationships with Him deepen and widen.

Your church council has dreams too. We do our best to listen to God speak to us at each meeting as we are united together. Then we plan and carry out some of these dreams. We trust the Holy Spirit is leading us.

At our most recent meeting, we continued discussion about some important topics. One ongoing topic is the State of Minnesota law allowing for same-gender marriage. We have prayerfully discussed this for the past five months.

We came to this conclusion:

"Acknowledging that there may be differences of opinion within the council and congregation, we support our pastor's decisions regarding marriage ceremonies." M.S.P. unanimously 12/10/2013

Yes, some might find these words vague. Honestly, it was intended to be that way. Was there ever a question about for whom the pastor would perform a marriage ceremony prior to this?

You trusted your pastor in the past to make these decisions. So the council affirmed that you would trust your pastor with future decisions she/he may make regarding weddings officiated by First Lutheran Church. The reality is that nothing changes. As your current pastor, I will continue to prayerfully discern any and all marriage requests that come to me. I simply ask you to prayerfully consider and respect all decisions made in the future in this regard. If you have questions or comments about this particular issue, please talk with me, a current council member, or one of the Pastor Parish Committee members.

The other vision discussed by council at the last meeting was the opportunity for additional ministry that will be presented at our annual meeting—adding a Parish Nurse position to the ministry staff at First Lutheran. I believe and dream that we would ALL benefit from this added ministry. I do not think this would take away from our existing ministry opportunities. I believe they would only be enhanced by it. What would a parish nurse do? Work along side each of us as a holistic health advocate for our lives.

Parish nursing is a partner in ministry designed for health promotion, disease prevention ministry based on the care of the whole person. There are seven key functions of the Parish Nurse. These functions are as integrator, the mixing of, faith and health, through the ministry of health educator, personal health counselor, referral agent, trainer of volunteers (Health Ministry associates), developer of support groups and health advocate all through the lens of faith.

What are your dreams for First Lutheran? Please share those with any council member and/or me in the months ahead as we continue to vision and dream of First Lutheran in 2025... and how we will look as we are "First... Servants of All..."

See you in my dreams and in church too!



ELCA Facts – Who Are We?

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is one of the largest Christian denominations in the United States, with about 4 million members in nearly 10,000 congregations across the United States, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

We are the church that shares a living, daring confidence in God's grace. For us, as the ELCA, this faith comes through the good news of Jesus Christ and gives us the freedom and the courage to wonder, discover and boldly participate in what God is up to in the world.

We are a church that is always being made new, and at the same time, is deeply rooted in Scripture, Lutheran theology and Lutheran confessions. We are also rooted in the vibrant, diverse communities and rich histories of our congregations. It's through these roots that the Holy Spirit guides and nourishes us so that we can be a church that is both resilient and always new.

As of 2012, there were 3,950,924 baptized members in the ELCA. There were 9,533 congregations organized in 65 synods in nine geographic regions.

The ELCA is a diverse church body, becoming more so every day. This church is committed to growing in diversity and strengthening its global, ecumenical and interfaith relationships around the world.

ELCA congregations are led by gifted men and women who have been called by God to serve their community. The ELCA calls both women and men to serve as pastors and lay rostered leaders. Here are some facts about ELCA leaders:

As of Oct. 22, 2012, there were 18,010 leaders on the ELCA roster including 998 associates in ministry, 64 deaconesses, 175 diaconal ministers and 16,773 ordained clergy. In 2012, 23 percent of clergy on the ELCA roster were women. In the

ELCA's eight seminaries, the numbers of women and men preparing for ministry are about equal. About 86 percent of ordained women and 83 percent of ordained men are actively serving in congregations.

The ELCA offers opportunities for Lutheran education at every level and considers education as an important part of our calling. We offer quality education at every level through our institutions. In addition to the eight ELCA seminaries and two seminary extension centers, there are 26 colleges and universities, 50 or more lifelong learning programs, 14 high schools, 296 elementary schools, 1,573 early childhood programs, 145 camp and retreat centers serving 450,000 annually.

The ELCA is committed to making the world a more just and peaceful place to live. Through programs, ministries and partnerships ELCA congregations, synods and the churchwide organization work every day to address inequities in political, economic and social systems and to end conflict and violence all over the world. We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world – together. This is Christ's church. There is a place for you here.


A Look at Our Ministry Together in the NE MN Synod of the ELCA

The ELCA is organized into geographic areas called synods. The word 'synod' comes from two Greek words, 'syn' (together) and 'hodos' (a way) meaning 'a way together' or 'walking together.'

'Together' is an important idea for understanding Christianity and the Church. In Christ, Christians are joined together in a common fellowship. God has intended us to function at our best in relationship to each other.

Some things can't be done alone, but must be done together. Practically speaking, this requires organization. The Northeastern Minnesota Synod includes 13 counties in the northeast corner of the state. It represents: over 72,500 baptized members, 138 congregations, 250 rostered leaders, and over 1,500 elected lay leaders. To lead and oversee its ministry together, our synod elects a bishop, provides an office staff, elects a synod council and other volunteer leaders, and organizes task forces, much as a congregation does. Much of our synod's work falls in two areas: support and development of pastors and lay leaders for their congregational ministry, and extending and coordinating ministry beyond the local setting.

Congregations base their budgets on regular giving by members. Each congregation decides annually what amount will be passed on to the synod as 'mission support.'



Here are some examples of what we do together as a synod:

ELCA National and Global Ministries:

- + Support 240 missionaries in 46 countries in 2012, 118 adults answered God's call to serve as missionaries!
- + 120 companion synod relationships (such as India, Russia, and Honduras in our synod)
- + 26 ELCA colleges and universities
- → in 2008, supported 49 new congregations and 33 under development
- + 14 high schools, 296 elementary schools, and 1573 early childhood programs ("Children First" Christian preschool is one!)
- → One out of 50 Americans are served by Lutheran Social Services of America (LSS).
- + World Hunger Appeal
- + Lutheran World Relief

Our synod staff organizes and supports many events and activities that our congregation participates in:


